Where Are They Now? Junior PGA Championship Golf Trivia

Over its 30-year history, the Junior PGA Championship has introduced golf fans to many of the game's top players. See if you can guess the PGA and LPGA professionals described here. You'll find the answers below.

- a) At age 16, he finished in a tie for third in the 1986 Junior PGA Championship. Eighteen years and 21 PGA Tour victories later, he sinks a critical birdie putt on the 18th green at the 2004 Masters to capture his first major championship.
- b) He finished in second place and 10 strokes off the lead in the 1990 Junior PGA Championship, one of the few majors he has never won. He rebounded by capturing three U.S. Junior Amateur titles, three U.S. Amateur titles, 43 PGA Tour victories and nine major championships, including this year's Masters.
- c) This 1996 Junior PGA Champion joined the LPGA in 2000, claiming the Rookie of the Year honor. She currently has six victories on tour, including her first major win at the 2004 Kraft Nabisco Championship.
- d) She defeated her twin sister by four strokes in the 1999 Junior PGA Championship to become the youngest winner of the Junior PGA Championship at the age of 13. She is currently on the LPGA Tour, and in her first major championship as a professional, finished second at the 2004 Kraft Nabisco Championship.
- **e)** He won the 1984 Junior PGA Championship with brilliant play down the backstretch just like his play in the 2001 PGA Championship where he claimed victory over Phil Mickelson. He is the first Junior PGA Champion to also win The PGA Championship.



Celebrating the 30th Year

A major national championship marks a milestone

Celebrating its 30th year, and fifth at the prestigious Westfield Group Country Club, the Junior PGA Championship has the rich heritage and tradition of a true 'major.'

The esteem of this national Championship for young men and women ages 17 and under is a credit to the vision of The PGA of America, which sets the same high standards in junior golf as it does for its other major events including The PGA Championship, The Senior PGA Championship and The Ryder Cup Matches. In fact, if not for the age of the contestants, it would be hard to tell the 2005 Westfield Junior PGA Championship from a PGA Tour event.

Spectators at the Westfield Junior PGA Championship are often surprised at the caliber of the Championship and the amenities, which include covered grandstands, roped fairways, real-time scoring, leader boards, pairing sheets, player biographies, a generous food court and more.

Players rave about the Westfield Junior PGA Championship experience. The PGA of America covers all expenses when junior champions from across the country travel to northeast Ohio to compete for the national crown. They share lodging at the exclusive Westfield Inn and dine together each evening. The practice facility features pyramids of new Titleist balls. They play a course that is set to PGA championship standards. Reporters clamor for interviews with the leaders following play each day. And often, for the first time, a player is asked for his or her autograph.

Perhaps nothing is more surprising than the quality of play by the junior golfers competing in this event. In 2002, a young Michelle Wie amazed spectators by driving the green on hole No. 1, a par 4, using a three wood! Last year, Miguel Cabrera set a new course record for the front nine by firing a 7-under-par 28 during the opening round.

Throughout its history, the Junior PGA Championship has been a steppingstone to greatness. The future stars of golf are coming to northeast Ohio. Will you be there to see them?



The Road to Westfield

The Westfield Junior PGA Championship has been called the most difficult invitation in junior golf. Every player invited to compete is a champion.

The field is comprised of the winners from each of 41 PGA Section Championships held across the nation. Players who finish in the top 10 from the prior year are invited to return if they are age eligible. Invitations are also issued to the top 10 point winners on the Callaway Junior PGA Series.

The Westfield Junior PGA Championship is played at Westfield Group Country Club, one of Ohio's best courses. Always in Championship condition, WGCC was established in 1937 by Westfield Insurance and has been used for entertaining customers and the independent agents who represent the Company ever since.

Over the years, the Club has grown and now features 36 challenging holes. The Westfield Junior PGA Championship is played on the South Course, a Goeffrey Cornish design with lush fairways, undulating terrain and mature woods. The course is known as much for its scenic beauty as its lightning-fast greens.

Holes to watch include No. 3, a signature par 5; No. 7, a treacherous par 3 that requires a carry of nearly 200 yards; No. 8, a risk-reward par 4 that may be the most beautiful on the course; and No. 18, an uphill par 5 where the Championship may be decided.

Westfield Group Country Club was selected to host the 2004 Junior Ryder Cup Matches. The Club has hosted the Westfield Junior PGA Championship since 2001.
